

Declaration of Compliance

REACH (Directive No. 1907/2006)

Sensitec with its locations Wetzlar and Mainz develops and produces electronic components and systems.

In that role, we process chemical substances and composites and hence by definition of REACH directive No. 1907/2006 act as a so-called “2nd level distributor”. Our products are neither raw materials and / or composites in the sense of REACH nor do they emit them during intended use. As a consequence, our products don't have to be registered according to REACH.

We order only REACH compliant products according to the latest SVHC list. Based on the information provided by our suppliers, we currently do not have any indication that our products contain forbidden substances or substances of very high concern (SVHC) as listed by REACH directive 1907/2006.

If our ongoing controls or information by our suppliers should indicate the presence of these substances in our products, we will promptly inform our customers.

In summary, it is stated that products distributed by Sensitec comply with the requirements of the REACH directive (i.e. last update of SVHC list dated Jun 2020).

RoHS (EU directive 2011/65EU) and supplement 2015/863

Sensitec is committed to develop and produce its products in accordance with the current EU directive 2011/65EU (RoHS II) and its supplement 2015/863.

Sensitec has gathered the necessary information by its suppliers and taken appropriate action to ensure RoHS compliance of its products.

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Conflict Minerals (Dodd-Frank Act, Sect. 1502 / EU Conflict Minerals regulation)DECLARATION

Since in some regions of the world earnings from raw material production are used to finance armed conflicts, a number of initiatives has been launched to cut the connection between the mining of raw materials and an aggravation of conflicts – amongst them Section 1502 of the US-American Dodd-Frank-Act and the EU Conflict Minerals regulation.

Sensitec generally supports the goals of such initiatives and moreover demands of its suppliers to comply with its code of conduct.

In line with the position paper of the electronic industry regarding conflict minerals drawn up by ZVEI (status as of July, 2013), Sensitec does not adopt a product-related approach and a continuous certification from the raw material all the way to the end product to allow full traceability. This is due, amongst other things, to the fact that Sensitec has a complex supplier structure and supply chain, respectively.

Furthermore, Sensitec is no importer of conflicts minerals or metal stage products as defined by the EU Conflict Minerals regulation; as a consequence, we don't have to comply with mandatory due diligence rules of this regulation.

Nonetheless, as part of our due diligence regarding conflict minerals, we have queried our direct suppliers of 3TG materials and, on the basis of the feedback received, are able to confirm to a certain extent the absence of conflict.
